The medical criterions of admittance of physically disabled persons to participation in the IPCA chess competitions

Group "A" (The main IPCA tournament – the IPCA Chess Championship)

The physically disabled chess players with considerably reduced efficiency of the musculoskeletal system:

- 1. Persons on wheelchairs and other, who have difficulty in walking.
- 2. Persons with cerebral palsy:
 - a) men and women with cerebral palsy of severe and moderate degree (the 1st and the 2nd group of disability),
 - b) boys and girls under 18 years with cerebral palsy in moderate and mild degree.
- 3. Persons with congenital deformation of the musculoskeletal system:
 - a) deformation of the limbs:
 - two lower limbs,
 - two upper limbs,
 - one leg and one arm,
 - one leg shorter more than 5 cm,
 - b) curvature of the spine heavy form (the 1st group of disability and the 2nd group of disability of the third degree),
- 4. Persons with acquired deformation of the musculoskeletal system:
 - a) amputations of the limbs:
 - two lower limbs,
 - one leg and one arm,
 - one leg above the knee,
 - two upper limbs above the wrists,
 - one upper limb above the elbow,
 - b) poliomyelitis or bone tuberculosis,
 - c) injuries of spinal (fractures) with partial or complete rupture of the spinal cord,
 - d) paralysis or paresis of two limbs (two legs, two arms, one leg and one arm),
 - e) myopathy or multiple sclerosis or myasthenia gravis,
 - f) polyneuropathy of severe degree (the 1st group of disability),
 - g) achondroplasia.

Group "B" (The open FIDE tournament)

The physically disabled chess players, who for medical reasons cannot play in Group "A" and the healthy chess players.
