


Here you'll park your car, now it's time to walk! Walk straight ahead and climb the stairs on the right. When you reach the pathway, turn left.

From here you can see the wood oven



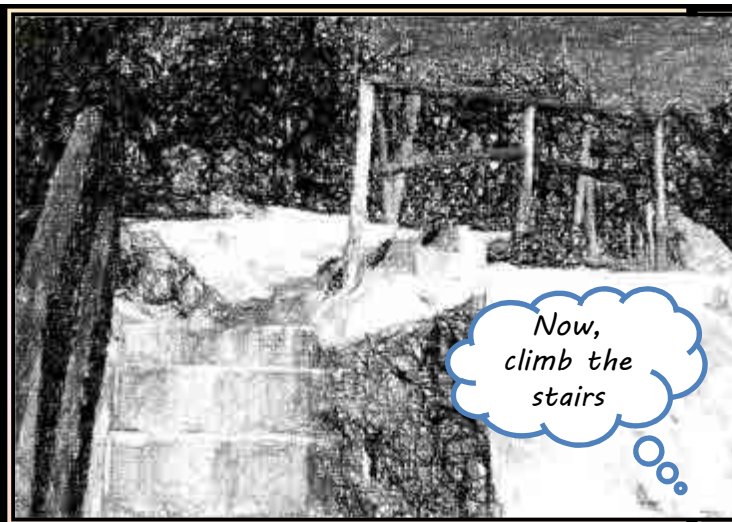
Follow the path to the water well but turn left in the wooden fence



... you're passing the lake ...



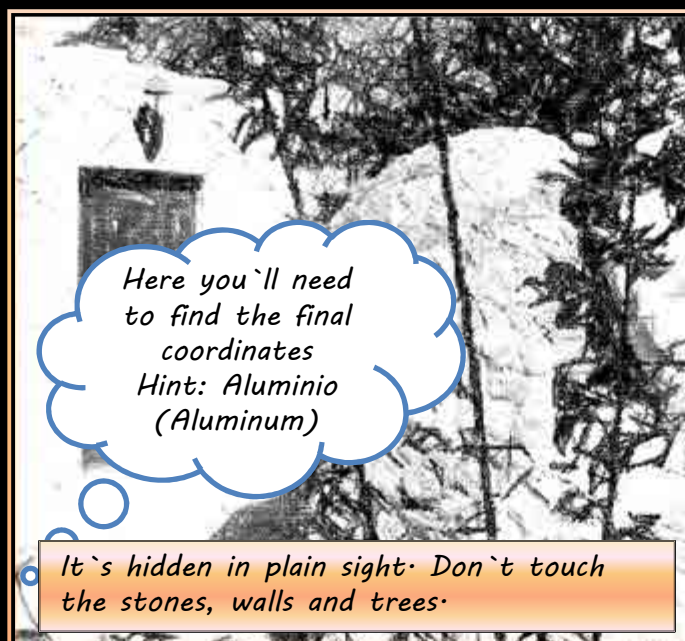
You are in the chapel. Have a seat and relax for a while.
